Education for Children and Youths

Education data in Indonesia shows that there has been an increase in the participation of children in school from every year, but there has been a decrease in levels. The enrollment rate has fallen from primary to junior high school level and from junior high to senior high school. This shows that school participation still requires attention and hard work from various parties, including improving the quality of education itself. The readiness of children to enter formal education also needs to be considered. One of the institutions to support this readiness is early childhood education.

Gugah Nurani Indonesia will pay attention to education issues, particularly in ensuring school age children participate in 12 years of education as well as improving youth employment skills, sensory and psychomotor abilities of children under five in order to prepare them for formal education.

Ensuring Children's Education during Pandemic COVID-19

During the pandemic, we were challenged to rapid adaptation toward the education. Distance learning were the only solution. However, not all children in our project areas were able to overcome this obstacle. To that end, Gugah Nurani Indonesia has supported learning materials, operational teachers who come to homes and provide training in creative teaching methods so that children still beable to study.







Skills Training for Youths

In 2020, Gugah Nurani Indonesia collaborated with the North Jakarta Regional Job Training Center (Indonesian: PPKD) to organize skills and job training activities for youth in the community area of Batavia CDP. The target participants were those aged 18 to 24 years. This collaboration was built to improve skills so as to get better job opportunities.

The training held for 45 working days and takes place at PPKD, North Jakarta. There are five vocational choices for participants to choose from, including make-up, housekeeping, culinary, mechanical engineering and graphic design. By the end of the training, participants received a certificate from the PPKD as well as a professional certification from the National **Professional Certification Agency** (Indonesian: BNSP).

Parent-Teacher Collaboration to Succeed Child's Learning **During The Pandemic.**

Indonesia government implemented Learning from Home mechanism during the pandemic to ensure children's safety from the spread of COVID-19. Parents have an important role because learning activities are carried out online or independently from home. The limitations that children and parents experienced during learning from home leads to various emotional challenges inside their house, such as boredom, anger, aggression, withdrawal, difficulty in concentration, communication, fear, and so on.

To prevent psychological impacts that may arise between children and parents, Gugah Nurani Indonesia conducted a ToT training for teachers in our supported community in Sukabumi CDP. This training focused on the cooperation between teachers and parents in completing the learning process at school. Some of the things to be achieved include the involvement of parents in the child's learning process, collaboration between parents and teachers in completing homework on time, the involvement of parents to prevent children from negative behavior and to motivate children to stay active in learning.

Hyundai Motor for Children's Education in Bojongmangu

Gugah Nurani Indonesia has implemented a project to fulfill child rights and community empowerment in Bojongmangu District, Bekasi Regency. This project is a collaboration with Hyundai Motor which was built together as a contribution to improving the quality of children's education in Bojongmangu. We also worked closely with the Bekasi Regency Government as the main stakeholder.

The project consists of two years of implementation, running from 2020 to 2021. In the first year, our work focused to increase the capacity of teachers and parents to support children's learning processes and the provision of mobile library cars as children's learning media. The main target beneficiaries of this project are teachers, parents, and children from 20 primary schools. The holistic impact in expected from this strategy.

Carrying out a project in the midst of a pandemic required Gugah Nurani Indonesia to adjust the design of activities. This needs to be done in order to reduce the risk of the spread of COVID-19 and the safety of people



involved. By implementing health protocols, training activities related to creative teaching methods, English and journalism classes for teachers could still be carried out. Meanwhile, for parents, we carry out training activities related to parenting and classes to read aloud.

Three units of Hyundai Motor cars have specially designed as mobile library to accomodate the convenience of children. We named the mobile library as LAMPU, which stands for *Literasi Anak melalui Perpustakaan Umum* (Children's Literacy through Public Libraries. The abbreviation is translated as lamp). LAMPU cars worked as a light for children's activity during the pandemic. During its operation, at least 2,942 children were recorded to have enjoyed the collection of books available.

Quality of Maternal and Child Health

One of the factor which should be considered to improve human resource quality in Indonesia is the health quality. Gugah Nurani Indonesia believes that the best interventions is for children under five years old, so that they able to grow well and healthy. High rate of child mortality and low quality of child feeding remains problem in Indonesia. Besides, prevalence of lack of energy chronically among pregnant mothers is still high, where the highest prevalence was found on mothers in teenage year. This condition was worsen by the lack of community access to sanitation and clean water facilities in some regions, which leads to the lack of awareness to implement clean and healthy lifestyle among society.

Gugah Nurani Indonesia state two objectives, they are to contribute to decrease the number of child marriage and to the prevalence of infectious disease among children under five years old

Monitoring the Nutrition of Children and **Pregnant Women to Prevent Stunting**

Kulon Progo Regency is declared as one of the provinces in Indonesia which is the focus location for stunting. The number of existing cases still requires attention and one of them is in Pendoworejo Village, the working area of Gugah Nurani Indonesia in Yogyakarta CDP. In collaboration with UPT Puskesmas Girimulyo I, we are implementing the Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF) program.

In 2020, there will be 11 caregivers for toddlers and 5 pregnant women who will be targeted by the IYCF program in Jetis Hamlet, Pendoworejo Village. Within a period of 10 months, monitoring has been carried out on them related to early breastfeeding initiation, exclusive breastfeeding, complementary feeding, nutritional fulfillment for pregnant women, routine examinations for pregnant women and breastfeeding until the age of 2 years or more. This is in accordance with WHO recommendations related to the IYCF which aims to encourage caregivers to implement the practice of feeding infants and children as well as fulfilling nutrition for pregnant women according to nutritional standards that meet the 4 star criteria.

After the monitoring period ended, the results obtained were 11 caregivers and 5 pregnant women showing efforts to fulfill nutrition according to the 4 star criteria (basic meals, animal protein, fruits & vegetables, nuts). As many as 10 out of 11 caregivers have tried to provide exclusive breastfeeding for children aged 0-6 months, and there are efforts to breastfeed until the child is 24 months old. Meanwhile, 5 pregnant women routinely went to health facilities. Thus, efforts to improve child nutrition in order to reduce stunting rates, especially in Pendoworejo Village have been successfully carried out. The same efforts will continue to be carried out by health cadres that have been formed.

"Before IYCF, pregnant women rarely paid attention to nutrition, the important thing is that they eat enough. Children under 2 years are used to eating rice and soy sauce. Caregivers believe, "as long as the child wants to eat, the mother will be happy". However, now the number of children with malnutrition at Posyandu Flamboyan, Jetis Hamlet has decreased. One child remains to stay under monitored. "

"On my 24th weeks of pregnancy, the midwife told me I had anemia and chronic energy deficiency. My weight was 46 kilograms, arm circumference 22 centimeters, and hemoglobin 11 g/dL. GNI provided me with nutritious foods, medical expenses, and transportation to the Puskesmas (health center). My child was born weighing 3.2 kilograms and is now 4 months old and weighing 7.5 kilograms."

"I was given nutritious food, including green beans, pregnant mother's milk and vitamins. Until delivery, I only weighed 45 kilograms, the hemoglobin was 10 g/dL and my fundal height was 18 cm. Thankfully, my child was born weighing 3 kilograms and after routine check-ups by the midwife, at the age of 2 months, he weighs 7.4 kilograms. Thank you GNI."





While the world is struggling with the COVID-19 pandemic and water has become an important instrument to prevent the spread of the virus, a number of citizens in Indonesia are still struggling with the availability of clean water in their lives. People of Company Ndejing Village of East Manggarai Regency are among them. The only source of water they use is from the Wae Musur River. It is located about 3 kilometers from residential areas. The access to the river is steep. After being tested, the water consumed by residents confirmed with E.coli bacteria. There is no spring in the village, while other possible source is to collect rainwater when the rainy season arrives. The bottled drinking water is available to purchase, but the money comes as another issue.

"It feels surreal, water is right before their eyes. The water flows so swiftly and clear, not as cloudy as river water", said Ahmad Djabur, the Village Leader. This facility was the first to successfully distributed clean water since the village was inaugurated in 1970. In fact, it was the first time that clean water could be owned by three generations of villagers who currently live in Compang Ndejing!"

Gugah Nurani Indonesia, assisted by the village government and villagers worked together to build this clean water facility by utilizing river water which is filtered by solar-powered pumps and pushed to residential areas with higher elevations. With this facility, villagers, especially children and women, as the main actors who take water from the river, no longer need to walk long hours to bring water to their homes.

Clean water has also flowed to Puskesmas (health clinic) as the village's only health facility. This is done to improve the health quality of villagers who were previously affected by the consumption of unsanitary water. Based on data from provincial health reports, several diseases that often found in villagers include intestinal infections, urinary tract infections, and various skin diseases. By the establishment of the clean water facility, the number of people suffering from illness due to E-coli infection is expected to decrease significantly.

Currently, 2,535 villagers from 565 families in Sok and Purang Mese Sub-village have been able to enjoy clean water directly from the water facilities built by Gugah Nurani Indonesia. Henceforth, a water committee was formed to further manage and maintain clean water facilities.



Economy improvement for Business Groups

Based on national poverty measurement (income per capita is less than USD 1 per day), the number of people living in poverty in Indonesia still reach 9.82% on early 2018. Majority of them are living in rural area. In the other hand, businesses only concentrated on western part of Indonesia, which means that production and the absorption of work force mainly happen in that area only. Gini ratio in Indonesia also still high. It shows that there is still a large income gap among society.



Economy Challenges to Overcome

To provide economic stability in our project areas, Gugah Nurani Indonesia worked with the community people through family food garden activities and alternative efforts to survive the COVID-19 pandemic.

Fish Crackers Help Children Go to School

Originally from Pantai Sederhana Village, Muaregembong District, Bekasi Regency. The group, which consists of women, processes the fish caught by the residents into fish crackers. "Sometimes, the fish catch was over and here the sun shines hot enough. We take advantage of this natural condition to earn additional income," said Hanisah, a member of the Lumba Belama business group who joined since September 2020.

Gugah Nurani Indonesia has facilitated the business group several production, such as a spinner, blender, sealer, digital gram scale, steamer pan, cracker cutting tools, and basic ingredients for making crackers. Previously, with simpler equipment, the maximum daily production amount was 5 kilograms. Currently, members are able to produce fish crackers up to 15 kilograms in one day. By

increasing the volume of production, sales are also expanded from previously only inside the sub-village, now fish crackers are sold to other villages. GNI also facilitated online marketing through the marketplace.

"My family income has increased since I joined and earn through the business group. Children's needs for education costs, such as transportation, school equipment, and health, such as nutritional adequacy and medical treatment costs can now be met."

Furthermore, the Lumba Belama business group will process the production permit and business legality. The target is to be able to sell Lumba Belama fish crackers in supermarkets and hypermarkets with a larger production volume, so that the income of the members will also be more sufficient for the family's needs.

Every Child is Respected

Gugah Nurani Indonesia pays special attention to child protection issue with the expectation that rights of every child in our working areas can be respected, fulfilled, and protected. This issue will be intervened in Gugah Nurani Indonesia's coverage and non-coverage areas, in which this issue includes 5 clusters of child rights, namely: (1) civil rights and freedom, (2) family environment and alternative nurture, (3) basic health and welfare, (4) education, utilization of spare time and cultural activities, and (5) special protection. Each CDP may perform intervention towards several or all of the clusters based on data and requirement, resource availability and case of children rights violation taking place in the work area.

Gugah Nurani Indonesia works with our commitment through the Child Protection Policy which applies to all parties, including staff, volunteers, and, partners in every line of the work.



Resilient Village Plus: Resilient Village Cares for Children

Surabaya Wonokusumo CDP developed a project to support Government program amid the pandemic COVID-19. Gugah Nurani Indonesia synergized the Kampung Tangguh Plus (Eng: Resilient Village Plus) program -Resilient Village Cares for Children which was a collaboration program initiated by stakeholders in 5 sub-districts of Semampir, Surabaya. Through this program, a series of online learning activities have been carried out for 6 times with topics around child protection and the pandemic COVID-19. This virtual meeting was attended by the task force and the community from 5 sub-districts, such as Ampel, Ujung, Sidotopo, Pegirian and Wonokusumo. As a form of encouragement for the Kampung Tangguh Plus task force, a media coverage is arranged to promote how they promote safe environment for the children.

We used #tangguhsakabehe (resilient in everything) and #tangguhsaklawase (resilient at all time) as slogans of promotion. The hope is that the spirit of building this resilient village is not only because of COVID-19, but it will stays in all sectors, including education, health, and child protection. On the other hand, it is hoped that this resilience can last permanently.

National Children's Day and World Children's Day Celebration 2020

Gugah Nurani Indonesia held the celebration of National Children's Day and World Children's Day 2020 with the theme, "Protected Children, Advanced Indonesia". A series of activities were carried out, including media coverage of children's activities, children's creation competitions in arts, through storytelling and making posters, media coverage and talk shows on "Resilient Village Cares for Children" and also a talk show with experts discussing the topic of "Study, be happy, and stop bullying during the pandemic".

CHILD PROTEC TION

Most of the activities were carried out online with the consideration of child safety and protection from the potential spread of COVID-19. We worked with local TV station to broadcast talk show activities so that children can keep up with from home. Through a children's creation competition, not only children from GNI project area in Wonokusumo were involved, some participants came from other areas in Surabaya, Sidoarjo, and several others from GNI project areas, such as Yogyakarta, Jakarta, Meulaboh, and Padang. Children's Day should be celebrated by all children in Indonesia that was the goal.

In the midst of the limitations and uncertainty of the pandemic conditions in Indonesia, Gugah Nurani Indonesia hoped to provide opportunities for children to be creative and express themselves through activities and their voices. According to Athoillah Isfandiari, an epidemiologist at Airlangga University, around 11% of children are victims of violence due to the COVID-19 pandemic as an implication from online learning conditions. Therefore, we also strengthen parents to survive this situation and continue to encourage their children while waiting for the pandemic to end. Most of the children involved expressed their hope of returning to school and playing with their friends soon.

Psychosocial Support for Children

Indonesia is one of the countries that is prone to disasters due to its geographical position which laid in the line of Pacific Ring of Fire, with many active volcanoes within. In 2018 for instance, there were two major disasters which affected many victims and losses, including casualties. Gugah Nurani Indonesia will continue to contribute to the approach of psychosocial program for children as part of our commitment to serve victims of disaster in emergency situation.

Surviving The COVID-19 **Pandemic**

11 March 2020, World Health Organization declared the coronavirus outbreak a global pandemic. Suddenly, the world was put to a halt.

Gugah Nurani Indonesia was challenged in a situation to run community development due to limitation of mobility caused by COVID-19 pandemic. Its consequences have affected entire systems of life and work. Gugah Nurani Indonesia has responded to the pandemic situation by continuing to provide essential services to address the many risks of COVID-19 within the communities where we work with.

COVID-19 INTERVENTION







Gugah Nurani Indonesia has implemented various emergency response interventions on COVID-19 from March to December 2020. These interventions included services for the community, families of sponsor children, partners, and stakeholders in 15 CDP Sponsorship and 1 Project CDP throughout 10 provinces in Indonesia. In carrying out interventions, we ensured that all personnel involved including staff, volunteer and community member equipped with personal protective to protect themselves and the beneficiaries they meet during the service.

Issue I: Children nutrition fullfilment during pandemic COVID-19.

30 children and **410** community member get access to develop family food garden.

428 children and 544 caregivers received support on nutritious food for pregnant, breastfeed women, and children with illness.

Issue II: Ensuring children education during pandemic COVID-19.

121 schools received health protocol facility package, including clothe mask, face shield, hand wash station, thermogun, and disinfectant.

13 early childhood education schools assisted by GNI received support on operational.

2,814 children received educational material support.

119 teachers completed training on distance learning.

244 children received assistance on psychosocial service.



HOPE SCHOOL PROJECT

Education is one of the basic needs in our life. The fact is that not all children can study in a proper and safe school building.
